The **Brennan Center for Justice** describes itself as “... a nonpartisan law and policy institute that seeks to improve our systems of democracy and justice”. Operating out of the New York University School of Law, the Center places its major focus on 5 issues: justice for all, voting rights and elections, liberty and national security, money in politics, as well as government and court reform. It is named after former Supreme Court Justice, William Brennan, considered one of the most influential and liberal justices of the 20th Century. The Center serves as a scholarly resource for legislators and others interested in racial justice and reducing mass incarceration, improving voter participation and ending unnecessary government secrecy. In addition, it focuses on legal ways to effectively fight terrorism while avoiding human rights violations such as torture. Through its website, the Brennan Center offers ways for individuals to get involved in its work and to stay abreast of current developments in the Center’s areas of concern.
